


Kristallnacht is the German name for the program sponsored by the Nazi government on the nights of November 9th and 10th, 1938. The program shattered not just vast quantities of plate glass (thousands of Jewish shops, warehouses and homes were burned or otherwise destroyed and hundreds of synagogues were reduced to smoldering embers); but it also eliminated all hope for continued Jewish existence in Germany. After Kristallnacht, German Jews lost their place in the country's economy, saw their cultural organizations dissolved and desperately sought to emigrate.

This week we mark the 85th anniversary of the dreadful night which ushered in the Holocaust. It is a time to remember the six million Jews who were murdered by the Nazis in Europe between the years 1939 - 1945.

During the Holocaust, Jews were often taken from the cities and towns in which they lived to concentration camps far from their homes. As the destruction of European Jewry progressed, the first gassing took place in Auschwitz, marking the first systematic genocidal assault in human history.

On this anniversary of Kristallnacht and the beginning of the Holocaust, let us impress upon our minds the words "whoever closes his eyes to the past becomes blind to the present."




The CSO students are currently taking orders for Apple & Pumpkin Pies for Thanksgiving.


Needs St. Thomas More Food Pantry Update "Thou shalt love your neighbor as thyself" the second of Jesus' great commandments as we were reminded
